Select Caesars Entertainment hotels charge for self-parking and valet parking. The parking policy is based on developments in our markets and is consistent with properties in other cities. Please check our guide below for details. Whether you visit for a few hours or a few days, we will provide convenient and secure parking for your stay.

Non-Lodger Guests:

- Non-lodger guests may be subject to pay a fee for self-parking and valet parking (see below)
- Parking pricing are subject to change

Registered Hotel Guests:

- Registered hotel guests may be subject to pay a fee for self-parking and valet parking (see below)
- Parking pricing are subject to change
- Self-parking includes in-and-out access at any Caesars Entertainment self-parking facility (subject to availability)
- Valet parking fees may be charged to your room bill
- You will use your room key to access all Caesars Entertainment property self-parking facilities

Caesars Rewards Members:

- Self-parking and valet is complimentary for Caesars Rewards members at the Platinum, Diamond and Seven Stars® levels. Valet for Platinum Members will only be available in select markets
- If you are at a qualifying level, you will use your Caesars Rewards card to access free valet and self-parking
- Caesars Rewards card must be present at time of transaction

Valet Parking

Hours: 24/7

Main Valet:

- Daily Flat Rate: \$50 (Retail, Gold)
- PLT/DIA/SEV: Complimentary

Colosseum Valet:

- Daily Flat Rate: \$40 (Retail, Gold)
- PLT/DIA/SEV: Free

Forum Shop Valet:

- Sun-Thu: 10am-11pm; Fri-Sat: 10am-12am: \$7 (Retail, Gold)
- After Hours/Overnight: \$25

Augustus Valet:

- SEV, Guy Savoy, Qua Spa guests ONLY: Free

To access the main Valet entrance, turn into the entrance of Caesars Palace off of Las Vegas Blvd., keep left, turn left at the intersection and proceed to the Valet podium.



Self-Parking

Hours: 24/7

Weekday Hourly Rates (Mon-Thu):

- 1 Hour: Free
- 1-3 Hours: \$15
- 3-24 Hours: \$18
- 24+ Hours: \$18 (each day or fraction thereof)
- Hotel Lodger: \$18 (charged per vehicle to room, allows in & out privileges with room key)
- PLT/DIA/SEV: Free
- Locals: First 3 hours free (with valid NV I.D.)

Weekend Hourly Rates (Fri-Sun):

- 1 Hour: Free
- 1-3 Hours: \$23
- 3-24 Hours: \$23
- 24+ Hours: \$23 (each day or fraction thereof)
- Hotel Lodger: \$18 (charged per vehicle to room, allows in & out privileges with room key)
- PLT/DIA/SEV: Free
- Locals: First 3 hours free (with valid NV I.D.)

For self-parking, turn into the Caesars Palace entrance off of Las Vegas Blvd. Keep right and turn right at the intersection. Get in the left lane and go past the Forum Shops Valet. At the next intersection (4-Way Stop), turn left into the Parking Garage entrance and follow the signs.

Oversize Parking

Not available.

Guest may use the oversize parking at Bally's. Bally's Self-Parking rates apply.

EV Charging Stations

Caesars Palace Las Vegas offers limited EV Charging stations available for electric cars through Valet Parking. Valet EV Charging stations are available on a first-come first-served basis. We currently do not offer any EV charging capabilities in our self-parking garage. The closest location is at The LINQ Hotel, which has Superchargers stations directly under the High Roller.

Drivers can access real-time information about the EV charging stations via a ChargePoint mobile application, which shows whether a station is open and the percentage of charge on their vehicle.

The Level 2 plug-in style chargers at Caesars' EV stations will accommodate all electric models and hybrids using a J1772 plug, which is industry standard for the majority of EVs with the exception of Tesla vehicles (they come with an adapter).

Charge time will vary depending on the vehicle's battery type, but on average it takes 6 to 8 hours to fully recharge from an empty battery at the stations.
